Sew a red heart button on the Jumpsuit front!



Doll Model Size

• This pattern is designed to fit **18 inch dolls** such as American Girl®

Printing the Pattern

- Pattern pieces are found at the end of the instructions. Check the scale of your pattern. Make sure your printer scale is set to "none" or Actual size.
- If you are using A4 Paper and your scale is not correct, set your printer to print "Letter" size
- Simply cut out the pattern pieces or trace them onto pattern paper.

General Sewing Instructions

- Seam allowance Sew a 1/4" seam unless otherwise stated.
- **"Finish off the seam"** This is to prevent fraying. If you do not have a serger, then use an overlock or zigzag stitch on your machine. Fray check can also be used. A nice zigzag to use on your machine: Set stitch length 2 and stitch width 2.
- **"Finish off the seam" for 2 layers** *Trim* the seam slightly and zigzag.

Fabric and Product Guide

- Mask Felt or marine vinyl (Marine Vinyl or Non-fray PVC Vinyl. The one I used is not the see through-type. It has a faux leather look to it.)
- Scarf Option 1 Medium weight woven OR knit fabric with stripes. Option 2 – Fleece
- Santa Sack Medium weight woven fabric Linen, Cotton or quilter's cotton.

You Will Need

- Mask Fabric – White marine vinyl OR felt – 4" x 5" ¼ Wide Elastic – 8"
- Santa Sack Red Fabric – 9" x 14" White Fabric – 5" x 14" String or Cord – 19"

- Scarf Option 1 Fabric (Woven / Knit) 2" x 28"
- Scarf Option 2 Fleece 1.5" x 28"
- Matching Threads
- Safety Pin or Bodkin
- Sticky Tape

Mask Instructions

1. Using the pattern piece, trace the mask on the BACK of the vinyl.



- 2. Cut all the way around and also cut out the two holes for the eyes.
- 3. Add a 1/4" wide or narrower (10 cord) elastic by sewing it down with your sewing machine onto the sides of the eyes of the mask as shown on the pattern piece.
- Elastic length = 8"

The Mask is now complete!



Scarf Option 1 - Fabric

CUT – Cut fabric – 2" x 28"

- 1. Finish the two long edges with a serger or zigzag stitch to prevent fraying.
- 2. Fold a long edge to the wrong side, ¹/₄" and sew close to the edge creating a hem.


Repeat for the second long side.

3. Measure from the bottom of the short end, 1" and mark. Sew a straight stitch on this line.

Repeat for the second short end.

4. Creating fringe: Woven fabric – Fray the short edge up to the stitched line creating fringe. Knit fabric – Cut strips up to the stitched line. Cut them about 1/8" apart creating a fringe.

The Scarf is now complete!




Scarf Option 2 - Fleece

Fleece - This fabric does not fray so will not need to be finished with a zigzag or serger.

 $CUT - Cut fleece - 1.5" \times 28"$

1. At the short end, cut the fringe. Cut 1" deep and make each cut 1/8" apart.

The Scarf is now complete!



Santa Sack Instructions

- CUT 1x Main Bag (on fold) Red Fabric
 - 1x Top Tab (on fold) White Fabric
 - 1. With WRONG sides together, fold the Top Tab in half lengthways.
 - 2. Align the long open edge of the Top Tab with the one long side of the Main Bag.
 - 3. Sew and finish the seam allowance. Press it down towards the Main Bag.
 - 4. Measure 1/2" from the seam on the Top Tab and mark. Stitch on this line to create the cord casing.

- 5. With right sides together, fold the bag in half sideways.
- 6. Sew closed the bottom and side edge of the bag. Stop when you get to the bottom of the Top Tab and secure the stitches.
- 7. Skip the cord casing and sew closed the side of the Top Tab. Secure the stitches.
- 8. Cut a length of cord or string, 19" long.
- 9. Cut a piece of sticky tape about 0.5" and tightly wrap it around each end of the cord to keep it from fraying. You can also burn the ends.

10. Using a safety pin or bodkin, thread the cord through the cord casing. Align the two ends of the cord and tie a knot about 1" from the end.


11. Turn the bag right side out. Push the cord through the opening so that it is on the outside of the bag.

The bag is now complete!


